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3Cognition Settlement:

Radiological Imaging Technologies, Inc. (RIT) and 3Cognition LLC (3Cognition) reached an agreement that resolved the patent litigation previously outstanding between them.

Without any admission of fault, 3Cognition has agreed not to sell the version of its FilmQA software product containing a calibration feature RIT asserted was protected by its U.S. Patent No. 6,675,116, for the life of the patent. The '116 patent covers a method of calibration used in intensity modulated radiation therapy (IMRT) that has enabled treatment of many more patients at a substantially lower cost per patient. 3Cognition may instead sell a redesigned product from which the accused calibration feature has been removed. The agreement stipulated that RIT would promptly dismiss its lawsuit against 3Cognition, which it has done in a Consent Judgment and Order for Permanent Injunction and Dismissal entered by the court on July 25, 2005. All other terms of the settlement are and will remain confidential.

RIT and 3Cognition believe this agreement will encourage respect for intellectual property rights while fostering fair and reasonable competition in the radiotherapy dosimetry industry.

RIT also reached a confidential settlement with Fluke Electronics Corporation, which was named as a defendant after it acquired the radiation management services business of Cardinal Health.
